FATHER WON'T LIKE IT



Something to Think About..."I will bless the LORD at all times: His praise shall continually be in *my mouth.*" ~ Psalm 34:1

Are you thankful to the Lord, blessing the Lord at all times under all circumstances? It's sometimes hard to comprehend how we can always truly have an attitude of gratitude. There's a funny story that perhaps puts our thankful hearts into perspective for us.

Serving a church in a distressed part of the city, a minister is counselling a man who complains, "Life is unbearable. There are nine of us living in just one room. What can I do?" The minister, recently having moved from a rural church, advises, "Get a goat and take it into the room with you." The man in incredulous, but does as the minister suggests. A week later the man comes back looking more distraught than ever. "We can't stand it," he says. "The goat is filthy." The minister then tells him, "Go home and get rid of the goat and I'll see you in a week." A radiant man returns a week later, exclaiming, "Life is beautiful. We enjoy every minute of it now that there's no goat only the nine of us."

How many of us know how to be truly thankful in the face of the trials and tribulations of life that often confront us? The Apostle Paul, having experienced so many tribulations was yet able to testify, "I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need" (Philippians 4:11-12).

It's not only the Apostle Paul, but many powerhouses of the faith have preceded us having realized the importance of mastering thankfulness. Even as an infant, Jesus was forced to flee with Mary and Joseph to a foreign land because the king, Herod, was looking for this child to destroy him out of fear and spite (Matthew 2:13-15). however, through the gifts of the maji who had visited the baby in Bethlehem. And God also provided for Jesus as He was in the wilderness facing temptation from Satan so that Jesus could rebuke the enemy, saying, "It is written..." and hold on through the Word of God. As we trust in God, we find we're unable to resist bringing Him praise.

Consider the reasons why we should praise God – He's full of glory, wise and powerful, able to meet all our needs, merciful and faithful, and so much more. To try to list all the things God has done is impossible, but it is a wonderful exercise because it turns our hearts back to Him and keeps us mindful of how much we owe Him.
