
THE QUIET BARBER

Something to Think About...



The trend today in Canada, as well as in many countries around the world is to have single parent homes where the father is absent, or if not physically removed, emotionally and spiritually absent in the lives of their children. As early as the 1990's it was observed that, "Though our society is only beginning to recognize it, the greatest family challenge in our era is fatherlessness..." (Louis Sullivan). The last thirty plus years have only seen this trend worsen. The Canadian Children's Rights Council recently published their report on Fatherless Children in Canada stating "Fatherlessness is one of the greatest social problems in Canada".

Cornel University professor Urie Bronfenbrenner, one of the most eminent developmental psychologists, wrote, "Children growing up in [father absent] households are at a greater risk for experiencing a variety of behavioural and educational problems, including extremes of hyperactivity and withdrawal; lack of attentiveness in the classroom; difficulty in deferring gratification; impaired academic achievement; school misbehaviour; absenteeism; dropping out; involvement in socially alienated peer groups, and the socalled teenage syndrome of behaviours that tend to hang together - smoking. drinking, early and frequent sexual experience, and in the more extreme cases, drugs, suicide, vandalism, violence, and criminal acts." An American study has concluded that father-deprivation is a more reliable predictor of a child's development including the increased likelihood of criminal activity than race, environment or poverty. Father-deprived children are 72% of all teenage murderers, 60% of rapists, 70% of kids incarcerated, twice as likely to guit school, 11 times more likely to be violent, represent 3 of every 4 teen suicides, are 80% of the adolescents in psychiatric hospitals, and account for 90% of runaways. (National Fatherhood Initiative (U.S.A.)

The fate of the future generations in Canada hangs in the balance. Yet God has shown us what we must do. In the last verses of the last book of the Old Testament, God lays the groundwork for what the family should be. As we

wait for the return of the Lord let us lean upon His Spirit to "turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers".

The mission of reconciling families is much more successful when Christ is present in the home. As we lift our eyes vertically and follow Jesus, we're much more aware of those for whom we're responsible for and much more likely to demonstrate the love and commitment to one another that we should.

James Merritt suggests most fervently "Dads need to rediscover the important joy they've been given - to partner with our wives in the nittygritty business of building character in our children". Only as fathers are present in their children's lives, having a heart for their children, can they model a life well-lived for them; only as fathers have surrendered to Jesus Christ. have chosen to be followers of God's Word, can they be the father God intended them to be in their children's lives.

This Father's Day, may we all pray for fathers to reconcile to their children and for children
