A little boy was asked by his mom what he had learned in Sunday School. "Well, Mom, our teacher told us how God sent



Something to Think About...

"I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth. He will not let your

foot be moved; He who keeps you will not slumber." (Psalm 121:1-3)

When this psalm was written, to look up to the hills didn't offer much for protection. Robbers dwelled in them, waiting for innocent travelers to become their unsuspecting victims meaning journeying through these roads caused anxiety. But the faithful people of God looked above the hills to the great God who created all things. When travellers caught sight of Jerusalem, nestled in the mountains, they knew that God dwelt there in His sanctuary and provided protection for all they needed.

Our lives can be like mountainous territory. We sometimes don't know what lies in wait for us today and as we look into the future, we wonder what dangers lurk? Yet, the Lord is our helper; He promises He protects us. Friends and relatives can offer limited assistance, used as instruments for God's purpose, but God knows everything and has all the power necessary to rescue us — our "help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth". So why should we fear or worry or wonder?

And our God is not a distant God. The Psalms also tell us "The LORD is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit" (Psalm 34:18). In Psalm 121:3 we're reminded, "He will not allow your foot to slip". So often we fear and fret because our lives seem to be in the midst of those mountains – our feet are unsteady leaving us to slip and slide, to stagger, to be shaken, in our circumstances. We become weary and defeated. But our God has provided everything we need to prevail including how to avoid temptation that causes us to sin. When we have Jesus as our Saviour, He give us the

Holy Spirit who directs and empowers us. God's Word lights our path so we do not slip. Yet at times, we choose to sin. Almighty God could stop us from disobeying, but He doesn't interfere with our free will. Instead, He upholds us, enabling us to walk in His way. He waits for us to call out to Him and when we do His promise is sure that "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

In a recent article, A Prayer of Protection, Ashley Moore wrote, "God refers to Himself as the Good Shepherd, who lays down His life for the sheep. And He says we are the sheep of His pasture (John 10:11-14). Sheep are rather defenseless animals. They do not have sharp teeth or claws to ward off predators. They are covered in heavy wool that makes them susceptible to overheating if not groomed regularly and vulnerable to drowning if they fall into deep waters. They are known for getting themselves into precarious situations. And they need a shepherd's constant care and protection to stay safe and alive." As we consider the Lord's ability to protect us, even in treacherous times, whether those troubles originate with others, external circumstances, or our own sin, where we can find ourselves in danger and afraid, we know we have a loving Sheperd who watches over us and leads us to safety. He reminds us we can always trust Him, that He will always protect us – especially when we're frightened or struggling with doubts. And we know the LORD never sleeps but watches over us to protect and lead us all the time. Just as He promised to keep Jacob, who became the father of the twelve tribes of Israel, and He protects Jacob's descendants, "The eyes of the LORD are on the righteous, and His ears are open to their cry" (1 Peter 3:12). We know, too, that "for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose". (Romans 8:28). God is our only trusted source for strength and our shield from

the enemy's constant fiery darts. Dr. David Jeremiah wrote, "When we are tempted to seek blessing & contentment in the things of this world, we need to look to God's promised blessings. Look around you today and count your blessings. Thank God for His provision and commit all your needs to Him." He is our Good Shepherd, He protects His flock, even at the cost of His own life. God, your Father, protects YOU!
